### THE MESSAGE OF MALACHI

The Book of Malachi contains four (4) short chapters, and reading it in its entirety takes roughly twenty (20) minutes. What the reader would discover by this exercise is the answer to the key question: What is God trying to communicate in verse 3:10? What's the overarching message of Malachi?

A synopsis of Malachi might look like this:


# YOU DON'T HAVE TO DO JACK!

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. - **Ephesians 2:8-9** 


Scripture teaches us that Jesus did it all on the cross. His last words on the cross were "it is finished" (John 19:30). That means that nothing else is necessary. So why do we continually struggle with what we 'have to do'? The answer lies in our sin nature — our pride. We mistakenly believe that our good works or our good intentions are needed to complete the deal. That sounds good to our fallen ears, it makes us feel a lot better, but it simply isn't biblical. Jesus did everything necessary. Romans 10:9-10 teaches us that all we "have" to do is believe.

In plain English, we don't have to do anything! We can't earn our salvation – it is a free gift of grace. The truth is that there is absolutely nothing you can do to make God love you more. It is also true the there is nothing you can do (or not do) to make God love you less. He loves you with a perfect love, and that will never change.

Because of that, we go to church not because we have to, but because we want to. We pray and read our Bibles not because we have to, but because we want to. When we exercise those and all other spiritual disciplines, we do so out of love and gratefulness to the One who gave His life for us (John 3:16). We do those things because we want to!

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#### SESSION 10 BIG IDEAS



Many Christians today have a deep-seated belief that tithing is an obligation. When you hear them ask questions such as "How much . . ." or "Do I have to . . . " or "Is it OK to . . ." in the context of giving, they reveal their legalistic leanings. Simply the way the questions are framed, and the words used demonstrate a belief that certain requirements exist and they have to figure out all the rules in order to pass some spiritual test. The GOOD NEWS is that Jesus fulfilled the requirements of the Law on the cross, once and for all. This is a truly liberating truth. Take plenty of time to let that ruminate through your mind.

Principle four: Giving is Opportunity, not Obligation!

#### PRAY TO GET FREE OF LEGALISM

Free me from any spirit that swells up in self-pride in my obedience — Lord I want to BE poor in spirit because I know I AM poor in spirit. I renounce the spirit of legalism — Holy Spirit, set me free.
