


JOY!

HOW TO GIVE?

Now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given orders to the churches of Galatia, so you must do also: On the first day of the week let each one of you **lay something aside**, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come. And when I come, whomever you approve by your letters I will send to bear your gift to Jerusalem. But if it is fitting that I go also, they will go with me. - 1 Corinthians 16:1-4

Giving should be Planned

So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver. **2 Corinthians 9:7**



Note the use of the word "purposes" here indicates plans. Planning is key, and it leads to giving cheerfully not because we are obligated ("of necessity"), but because we choose to give. Planning enables us to give with contemplation (i.e. with forethought), without reluctance, without pressure (emotional or spiritual), in faith expecting a harvest.

- What you give is what you receive Galatians 6:7
- What you receive depends on the measure you use Luke 6:38
- Expect both temporal (earthly) and eternal rewards Mark 10:29-30
- Giving credits a heavenly account Matthew 6:19-20
- Consider the time between sowing and harvesting Galatians 6:9
- Persevere through faith and patience Hebrews 6:12

WHEN TO GIVE?

Remember Principle four? "Give, Save, Live on the Rest!" Giving happens when you think about and prioritize giving into your budget. Giving happens when you make it a priority in your spending patterns. Giving starts in your mind when you make the decision to give.

• Giving should be Periodic

If you get paid every two weeks, monthly, or even less frequently, you should consider giving on a consistent weekly basis. The reason is that it helps to plan your giving, develop the habit, and exercise the discipline on a routine basis. Make giving a consistent part of your Sunday corporate worship experience.

WHERE TO GIVE

As a reminder, there are no "giving rules". There are no obligations. However, there are principles that can be gleaned from the pages of Scripture to inform us of God's desires in the area of giving.

As the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25, Luke 19) as well as other passages from Scripture tell us, we will all one day give an account to the Lord for how we used His resources. That includes our time, talents, temple (body), and treasure. This accounting will take place at what is referred to as 'The Bema Seat' of Christ. We will be judged and rewarded (or not) on how well we utilized His resources for kingdom purposes.

Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire. - 1 Corinthians 3:12-15

Giving should be Purposeful

If we are to be held to account, then it follows that we ought to be careful in how we utilize His resources. We should be discriminating. Not all uses of His resources are of equal value.

In Old Testament days, tithes and offerings were gathered into the storehouse (see Deuteronomy 14), which referred to the temple or synagogue. The storehouse was the focal point for the community of faith. From the storehouse, the needs of the priests (Levites), the widows, and the poor were met. The storehouse provided the resources needed to take on the work of the temple and supply the annual festivals.

Today, the local church functions as the 'storehouse'. The local church meets the needs of the pastoral staff who preach and teach the local congregation. The local church should provide the setting and resources for corporate worship and ministry. The local church should lead the way in meeting the needs of the poor in the local community as well as providing a launching point for missionaries to distant peoples. Therefore, our first priority in giving should be the local church.

However, the local church cannot do it all. One of the amazing aspects of the global Church – the Body of Christ – is its size, complexity, and diversity. There are parachurch organizations (outside the traditional church) that do amazing work in ministering to peoples' needs and advancing the kingdom. However, not all charitable organizations are equal. As stewards, we should be diligent in making sure our giving only goes to organizations that align with Scripture and utilize resources given to them effectively.

How do we tell which ones are worthy? Do your homework. With the resources available online, it's fairly easy to research how well an organization uses its resources. It's fairly easy to determine if an organization adheres to biblical principles. If in doubt, ask your pastors whether an organization is worthy of your giving. Make sure your giving is meeting real needs. Make sure your giving is purposeful!

Giving should be Proportional

God doesn't give us a precise amount precisely because He wants us to trust Him and give generously. For some, that might be 10%. For others, it might be 4%. And yet for others, giving generously might mean 25%. How do we figure out the 'right' amount? Take this question together with your spouse (if married) to God in prayer and allow the Holy Spirit to guide you. After all, what God was after as recorded in Malachi was not Israel's money – He was after their hearts! If God truly has your heart, you will be a cheerful, generous, radical giver!

GOD'S VIEW OF GREED
